


Fig 2. Forecast for the growth of the population of Uzbekistan (until 2050)




Fig 3. Science-based medical norm of consumption of basic foodstuffs per capita in Uzbekistan, kg (pcs.)




Fig 4. Forecast Analysis of food demand of the population of the Republic of Uzbekistan (2023-2050 yy.)*
